2023 Colville Tribal Member Okanogan & Columbia Rivers Ceremonial and Subsistence Sockeye Salmon Fishery Regulation

Justification

This fishery targets ESA-unlisted Okanagan Sockeye salmon. The run pre-season forecast is sufficient to support tribal harvest. This fishery is regulated to comply with CCT's yearly harvest allocation of Sockeye salmon, the CCT goals for Sockeye salmon conservation (hatchery broodstock and spawn escapement) and to avoid significant take of ESA-listed threatened Upper Columbia River (UCR) steelhead needed for spawning escapement and broodstock. As such, this fishery may be closed or otherwise amended by the Colville Tribes' Director of Fish and Wildlife (Director) to comply with harvest allocations, broodstock and escapement needs and/or to protect ESA-listed UCR steelhead.

Fishery Location/Period/Gear

Location: Okanogan River

Okanogan River from the Hwy 97 Bridge in the Columbia River confluence area near Brewster, WA, to the international border with Canada near Oroville, WA, <u>except fishing is prohibited from 400 feet below Zosel Dam to the log boom 200 feet upstream of Zosel Dam.</u>

Period:

July 1, 2023 through August 31, 2023, unless closed by the Director.

Authorized Gear:

Multi-strand tangle nets, hook and line (bait allowed), hand dip nets and hoop nets. Gill nets prohibited.

o Tangle nets: mesh size- 3" or greater stretched, net length not to exceed one-half (1/2) the wetted river width, or 100 feet, whichever is less. Mesh size may be amended by the Director via In-Season Regulation Change

Location: Columbia River

Main-stem Columbia River from the Hwy 17 Bridge in Bridgeport, WA, to the Hwy 97 Bridge upstream of the Okanogan River confluence area.

Period:

July 1, 2023 through August 31, 2023, unless closed by the Director.

Authorized Gear:

Multi-strand tangle nets, hook and line (bait allowed), hand dip nets and hoop nets. Gill nets prohibited.

O Tangle nets: mesh size- 3" or greater stretched, net length not to exceed one-half (1/2) the wetted river width, or 100 feet, whichever is less. Mesh size may be amended by the Director via In-Season Regulation Change

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Special Regulations/Restrictions:

- o Release all floy-tagged, radio-tagged and tail-punched fish
- o Hatchery-origin Chinook (adipose fin absent) retention allowed with concurrent Chinook regulation
- o Release all wild Chinook (adipose fin present)
- Release all wild steelhead (adipose fin present)
- Release all hatchery steelhead (adipose fin absent with healed scar), unless concurrent with an authorized, hatchery steelhead fishery
- Release all Bull trout and sturgeon
- o Coho retention allowed
- o Snagging prohibited
- Gillnets prohibited
- o Gaffs and spears prohibited
- o All tangle nets must be registered at the Nespelem Fish and Wildlife Office
- o All tangle nets must display net registration tag (tag provided during net registration)
- Tangle nets must be checked for fish every twenty minutes and may not be left unattended
- Tangle nets that are fished between official sunset and official sunrise must have lighted buoys on both ends of the net unless the net is attached to a boat. If the net is attached to a boat, then one lighted buoy on the opposite end of the net from the boat is required
- o Snagging prohibited from Scaffolds. Hook and line fishing from Scaffolds allowed (bait allowed), except scaffolds priority to hoop and dip net fishing
- o Parking at Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area in designated areas only
- Alcohol and illegal drugs (including marijuana products) prohibited at the Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area
- o Quiet hours at the Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area 10 pm-8 am
- o Cleaning of fish at the Colville Tribal Fish Hatchery fishery area prohibited

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Harvest Reporting:


- O All fishers will record the number of fish encountered on a Salmon Harvest Report Form. Information will include date of fishing effort, number of adult Chinook harvested, number of jack Chinook harvested (less than 62 cm or 24 in); number of wild Chinook released; number of Sockeye harvested and or released; number of wild steelhead released, number of hatchery steelhead (adipose fin absent) harvested or released, number of sturgeon released and number of Bull trout released.
- O Harvest information must be provided to Tribal creel clerks and other authorized Tribal Fish & Wildlife personnel upon request.

All fish that are encountered must be recorded on a Salmon Harvest Report Forms and submitted to Fish & Wildlife on a weekly basis and no later than October 31, 2023. MS-222 Warning:

Floy-tagged, radio-tagged and tailpunched fish that are caught in this fishery should be released and not eaten. It is unsafe to eat these fish because they are anesthetized with MS-222 (a known carcinogen to humans) in order to implant the tags conduct otherwise stock or assessment research. They are identified with a colored, external floy tag located near the dorsal fin, radio antenna protruding from the mouth or body and/or a small hole (1/4" diameter) in the upper lobe of the tail.
